HOW TO STAY IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE UNION: STAY CURRENT ON YOUR UNION DUES PAYMENTS

If you miss work and you do not receive a paycheck, your union dues will not be automatically paid, and you risk going into a bad standing status with the union.

Q&A:

How can I make sure I stay in good standing at the Union?

Check your pay stub each paycheck to make sure union dues are being deducted. If union dues are not being deducted, you can make arrangements with the TWU Bookkeeping department to catch up on missed dues payments.

What happens if I miss dues payments?

Missing dues payments can cause you to go into a bad standing status, and you will not be able to participate in Union functions, including meetings, elections, voting.

How do I catch up on missed dues payments?

You can restore your good standing status by catching up on missed dues payments in person at the Union office, or by making a credit card payment through the Clover payment service. Contact Bookkeeping if you would like to catch up on missed dues payments by credit card.

Per the TWU Constitution Article XIII, Section 3: “Membership dues are due and payable on the first working day in each calendar month. Any member who fails to pay his/her dues for a particular month on or before the fifteenth (15th) day of each month shall be in bad standing.”

Article XIII Section 4: “Any member in bad standing shall be ineligible to attend Union meetings, to be a candidate for or hold any Union Office or position, or to vote in any Union election or referendum, or otherwise to participate in Union affairs. He/she shall not be restored to good standing until he/she has met all his/her financial obligations to the Union.”
